

# NOTICE RELATING TO AGE

It is an offence to supply intoxicating liquor to a person under the age of 18 on these premises.

It is an offence to supply intoxicating liquor to any person for consumption by a person under the age of 18 on these premises.

It is an offence for a person under the age of 18 to obtain or consume intoxicating liquor on these premises.

It is an offence for any person to obtain intoxicating liquor for a person under the age of 18 on these premises.

Where there is doubt as to whether a person is aged 18 years or over, intoxicating liquor will not be supplied to the person on these premises except on production of evidence showing the person to be 18 or over.

Acceptable proof of age documents are:

- a passport;
- a photo card driving licence;
- an electoral identity card; and
- a photographic identity card of type approved by the British Retail Consortium for the purposes of its Proof of Age Scheme (PASS)

It is required for this notice to be displayed in each bar area of a club where alcohol is being dispensed, from 1<sup>st</sup> May 2012.

Not to do so will be in breach of the provisions of the Licensing and Registration of Clubs (Amended) Act (NI) 2011 and the Registration of Clubs (Notice Relating to Age) Regulations (NI) 2012.
